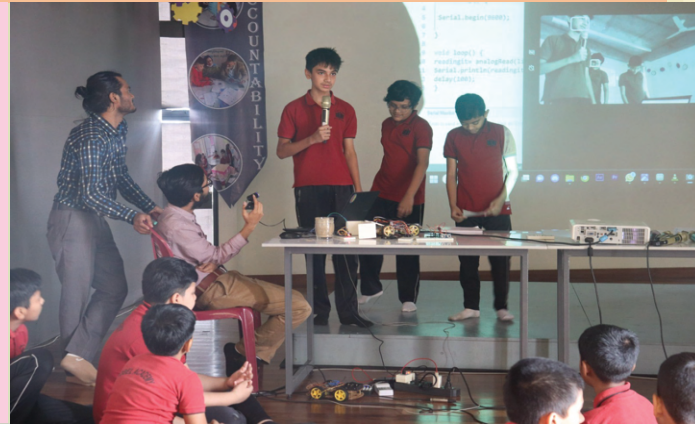
Ramadan Day
